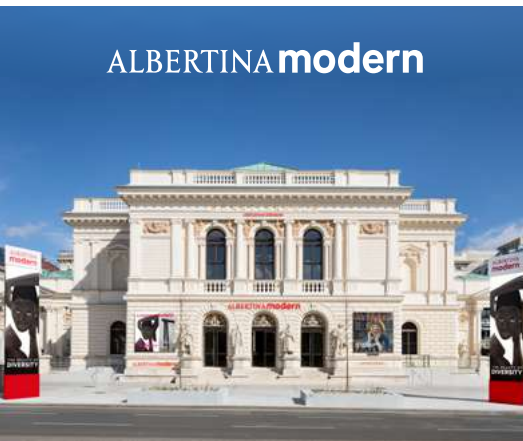


# ALBERTINA

Located in the heart of Vienna, the ALBERTINA brings together art appreciation and imperial flair. The state-of-the-art, internationally renowned museum is part of the Hofburg and housed within a historic former Habsburg residence.

Art connoisseurs and visitors to the city from all over the world will appreciate the ALBERTINA for its comprehensive displays and exceptional, varied programme of exhibitions. Austrian and international artworks, from the Middle Ages to the modern day, collection highlights and pieces on loan from all corners of the globe – there's something here to satisfy all tastes. But the name ALBERTINA doesn't just represent a building and a museum: most importantly, it represents one of the oldest, largest and best-known collections of art in the world.

## HABSBURG STATE ROOMS



ALBERTINA

The typical Viennese blend of old and new in the modern exhibition building and historic former imperial palace is what makes the ALBERTINA special as a tourist attraction. 20 state rooms that have been restored and furnished in accordance with their original design take you back in time to the days when the Habsburgs resided here.

How did the founder of the ALBERTINA Duke Albert von Sachsen-Teschen and his wife Marie-Christine live?

What was it like to be the favourite daughter of Queen Maria Theresa and indulge in all the luxury of courtly life? Original inlay floors, richly coloured silk tapestries, chandeliers, sumptuous furniture and other opulent finishing touches bear witness to the grandeur of times gone by and allow you to experience up close the extravagant lives of the archducal family from 250 years ago.





# MONET TO PICASSO

## The Batliner Collection

**A date with Monet, Picasso & Co.:**  
**The 500 pieces in our permanent display collection are sure to lead to discussions about classical modernism**



With the Batliner Collection, which is a long-term loan, the ALBERTINA is in possession of one of Europe's largest and most prestigious collections of classical modernism artworks.

The most prominent stylistic trends from impressionism to cubism are on display 365 days a year in a dedicated gallery at the ALBERTINA. To start off, there are works by French impressionists and post-impressionists such as Monet, Degas, Cézanne, Renoir and Matisse. Further highlights come from the examples of German expressionism with pieces from the two main groups of artists, Die Brücke (The Bridge) and Der Blaue Reiter (The Blue Rider), as well as from the Russian avant-garde, represented by Malevich, Kandinsky and Chagall. There is also an in-depth focus on Austrian works by Kokoschka and the New Objectivity movement. Surrealism comes in the form of Magritte, Max Ernst and Miró. Rounding off the exhibit are works by Picasso, and in addition to his early cubism, his later, more experimental pieces are most certainly worth seeing.



## TEMPORARY EXHIBITIONS

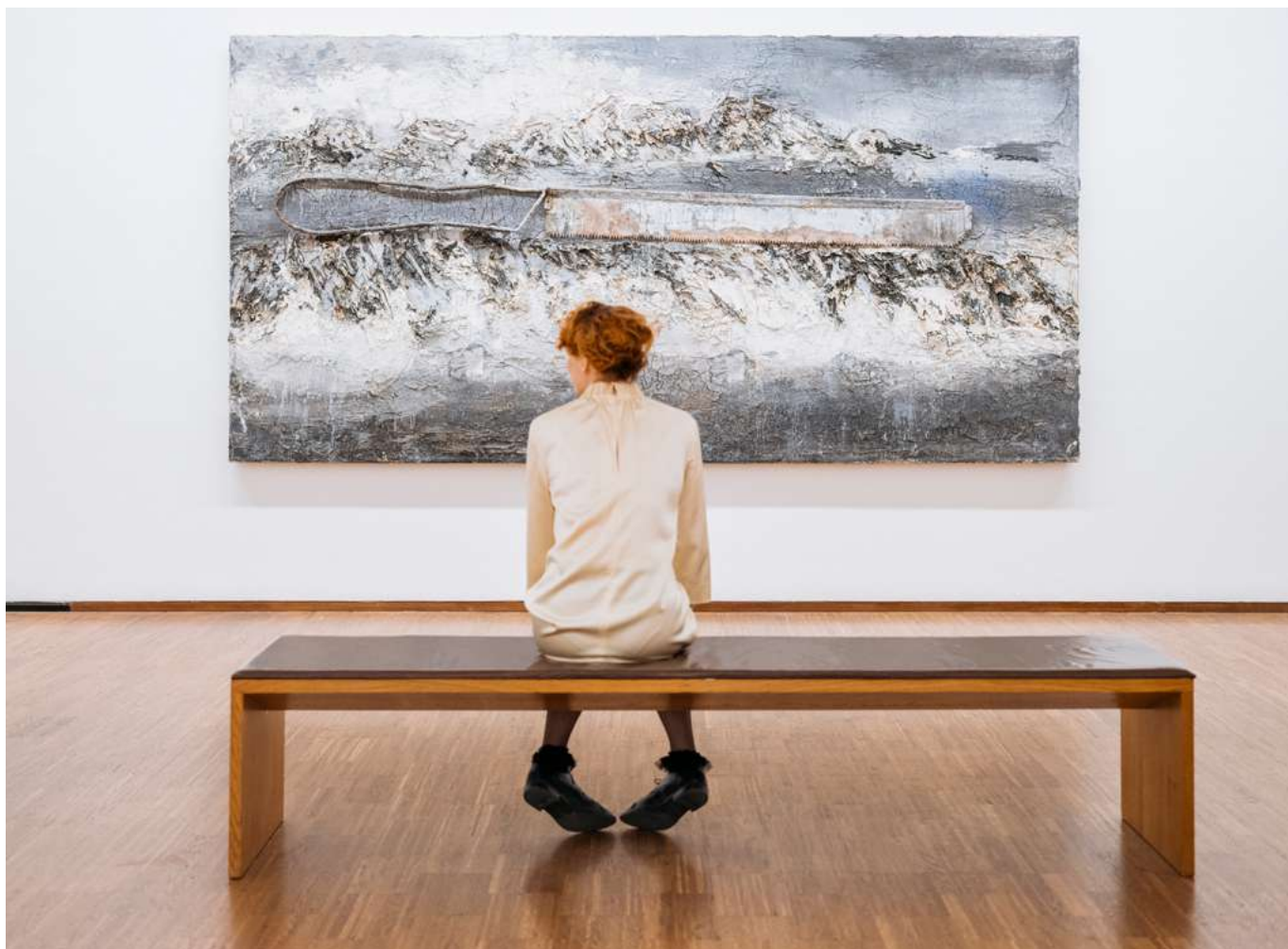
### 14 different exhibitions every year



Alongside the permanent display collection, the ALBERTINA is also home to a diverse programme of exceptional temporary exhibitions. Displayed in four different halls, they normally run for periods of three months each throughout the year. The museum's own exhibits are combined with international loan pieces to create unique compilations. The presentations cover periods of art history from the Middle Ages

to the present day, showcase a particular artist or embrace a broad theme. This means none of the numerous movements and art forms are left out, with all techniques represented: from painting, sculpture, drawing and photography to installations, video and readymades.

## A second location

ALBERTINA MODERN is the place to be to experience Austrian and international artworks from 1945 to the present day.



ALBERTINA modern

Located just a short walk from the main museum, it has two halls that present changing exhibitions. The historical building at the site was built in 1865 and has been renovated in a manner true to the original design. The building offers an interesting contrast to the programme of contemporary art featured in its two halls.

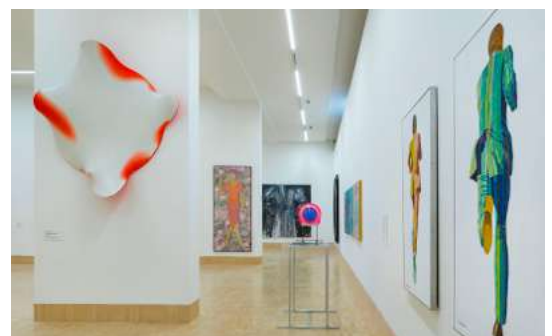


# ALBERTINA KLOSTERNEUBURG

## A third location

On the Danube, at the gates to the city

ALBERTINA KLOSTERNEUBURG allows visitors to enjoy the artworks from the ALBERTINA museum's unique collections in a setting outside of Vienna as well. This ALBERTINA museum location presents selected works from the museum's collections in changing exhibitions. The focus here is on the collection of post-1945 art, which has grown considerably over the last few years as a result of numerous donations. The modern museum building with an appealing architectural design is located only 3 km from the Vienna city line in a green area right next to the Danube River.

Alongside the familiar audio devices that can be hired at the museum ticket desk, the ALBERTINA also offers smartphone guides within Austria, allowing you to listen to an audio tour, contactless, on your own phone. # GENERAL INFORMATION

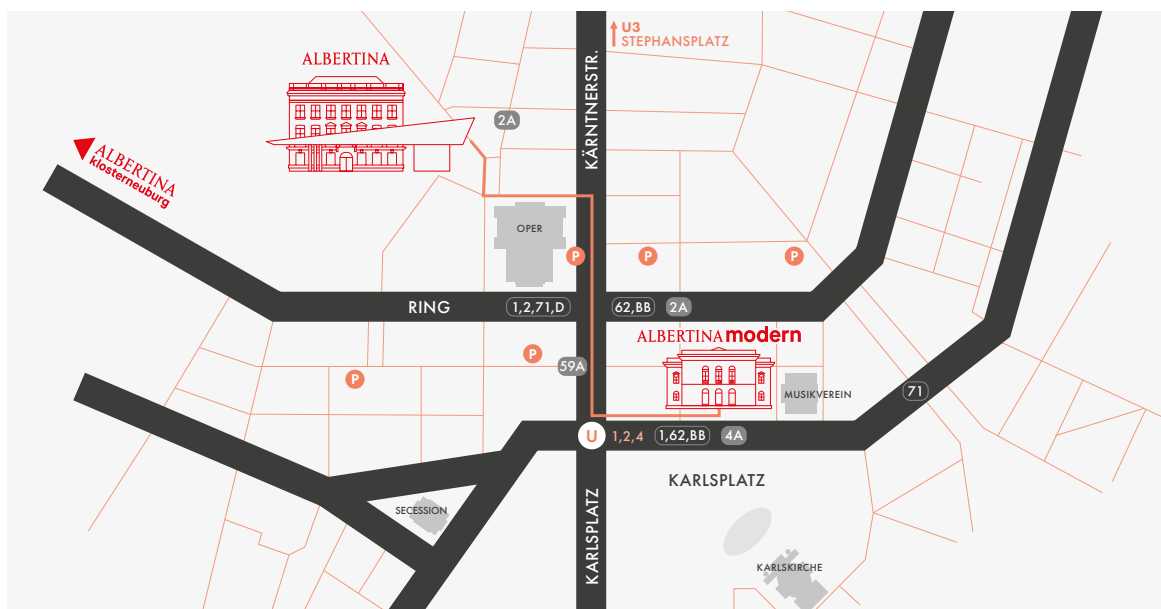
## ARRIVAL

The **ALBERTINA** is located in the centre of Vienna and is part of the Hofburg, near the State Opera, Hotel Sacher and Kärntnerstrasse.

Just a few minutes' walk away, you'll find the **ALBERTINA MODERN**, right next to the Musikverein, Ringstrasse, Hotel Imperial and the Karlskirche.

**ALBERTINA KLOSTERNEUBURG** is located just a few kilometres outside of Vienna and can be easily reached via public transportation or by car or tour bus.

All museum locations are accessible for people with disabilities.



### By car

The whole of the 1st district is a paid short-stay parking zone. The Kärntnerring car park, the Kärntnerstrasse underground car park, the Palais Corso car park, the car park on Robert-Stolz-Platz and the car park on Opernringhof are available nearby. Free parking spaces for cars are located right outside ALBERTINA KLOSTERNEUBURG.

### By coach

Pick-up and drop-off points for tour buses are located close to both the ALBERTINA and ALBERTINA MODERN. If necessary, we will be happy to make arrangements to get you a permit that will allow your bus to enter the 1st municipal district in Vienna (Innere Stadt). ALBERTINA KLOSTERNEUBURG has its own bus parking spaces.

**By bicycle:** Bicycle stands are located very close to the ALBERTINA and ALBERTINA MODERN entrances. The Danube Cycle Path runs directly past ALBERTINA KLOSTERNEUBURG. Bicycle stands and electric charging stations are located right in front of the building.
